NHS Surrey End Funding for Home Visit Foot Care Service



NHS Surrey (formally Surrey PCT) has informed NWSADP that they will be ending Partnership funding for the Home Visit Foot Care Service from July 31st 2009. This devastating news will mean that the valued service in Woking is at risk.

In a letter to NWSADP in January, the health provider for Surrey said “The review identified duplication and gaps in service provision and we as a PCT must adopt a consistent approach to commissioning services across the whole of Surrey. This service was only being provided to clients in the North West and it would therefore be inequitable to continue with the service provision.” In response to this news Cliff Bush OBE, Chair of NWSADP said “This is a very disappointing action by the PCT. Because they only fund a good service for disabled people who can’t access basic foot care in one part of Surrey, they decide to pull the plug rather than thinking of ways of offering a similar service across Surrey”.

NWSADP was awarded the Partnership funding in 2006 to fund the scheme which has employed a Foot Care Worker to visit disabled people in their own homes, to offer a low cost nail cutting and basic foot care service, which otherwise many people with limited mobility and low incomes have difficulty accessing. Cliff went on to say that “We are looking at options to ensure that this vital service continues. I would urge everyone who uses the service to write to their MP and local borough and county councillors to make sure they know how you feel”. The foot care service currently has over 450 clients using the service in Woking.



Help us to Keep the Foot Care Service

We need the support of NWSADP members, supporters and users of the service to ensure that the domiciliary foot care service continues. You can do this by writing to the MP for Woking, Humphrey Malins MP as well as local Councillors. We have enclosed a draft letter to the MP and Councillors on which you may choose to base your letter, adding your own experience etc. We have also added a draft letter that you may wish to send to your local paper. Getting Around



Train Station Improvements

Works to install new footbridges at Bracknell and West Byfleet are due for completion as we go to press. The schemes will provide level access to all platforms at the stations for the first time. These schemes are being delivered as part of the Governments £370million 'Access for All' schemes, which will provide level access at a number of stations across the network. Works at Clapham Junction are underway and the new lift shafts for platforms 1 to 6 were put in over the Christmas period and it is hoped that all the works will be completed by autumn 2009. Work to install new lifts has also started at Fareham, Fratton, Havant, Southampton Airport Parkway and Vauxhall.

In addition to these large schemes, the Government and South West Trains are funding a number of smaller schemes right across the network. A new ramp on the Woking-bound platform at Walton on Thames is complete as well as one to the Reading-bound platform at Feltham.

New ramps on both platforms at Staines have been installed as well as a new accessible toilet and split height ticket office counter. The counters allow wheelchair users and people of short stature to access ticket offices and are being installed at a number of stations in the coming months including London Waterloo, Bracknell, Haslemere, Havant, Southampton Central and Vauxhall.

South West Trains say they prefer passengers who need assistance to contact them 24 hours before travel to help make sure everything is in place. Although you can do this for peace of mind, you are not required to give SWT 24 hours notice when booking assistance.

South West Trains Cut Front Line Staff

The train operator has announced that they are making over 500 staff redundant, including ticket office, revenue and station staff. This could have a serious impact on the standard of service offered to disabled people across their network. Although their head of customer service seems to think it won't. Let us know if you come across any problems but also make sure you contact South West Trains to register your complaint too.

Try the Train Event

South West Trains are holding a 'Try the Train' day at Guildford station on April 14th. This gives disabled people who may not have used the train for a while the opportunity to get familiar with the station and trains. Train staff are also there to answer any questions.

The event – running from 09.30am to 16.30pm - is open to individuals, carers and local groups. Individuals are welcome to turn up on the day but we do ask groups to book a place. Air Travel – Rights for Disabled Passengers

With the summer on its way (apparently) some of you may be considering flying to your holiday destination. A lot more of you may have thought about it in the past and decided that air travel for disabled people is not great. A new EU Regulation on the Rights of Disabled Persons and Persons with Reduced Mobility when Travelling by Air came fully in to force in July 2008 and this means that tour operators, airlines and airports can now be challenged in law for refusing to take a booking for air travel for a disabled person or offering assistance. If you feel you have had a rough deal and the airline, airport or tour operator has not dealt with your complaint satisfactory, contact the Equalities and Human Rights Commission (formally DRC) and they can give you advice on taking your complaint further.

Cyclists May be too Close for Comfort

Woking Borough Council and Surrey County Council are intending to introduce a new scheme which will allow cyclists to ride their bikes in pedestrian areas of Woking town centre. The scheme will mean that pedestrians will be sharing the same area as cyclists. NWSADP is totally apposed to this idea and will be making this clear to both the borough and county council. We feel that this initiative will put disabled people and other pedestrians at risk.



Woking Access Group or NWSADP have not been consulted on this scheme at any point! We have now asked if either authority has carried out an Equality Impact Assessment as part of their Disability Equality Duty.

Katy Tells us More

“I started my role as part time Foot Care Worker with NWSADP in June 2006. By January 2007 I had taken on a full time position. I am responsible for the delivery of the Foot Care Service for disabled adults in the borough of Woking. My job involves registering clients, booking appointments, record keeping, reporting to our funders and Trustees, preparation of equipment, also giving presentations, attending training and meetings, making referrals to GPs, nurses, podiatrists and most importantly, treating our clients’ feet.



Working with disabled people has been challenging but very exciting. I love meeting and working with my clients and colleagues and I am confident to say, my clients value the foot care service.

Over the three years, I have visited 681 people. Three quarters of them I am continuously providing the service to. I do approximately 300 visits in a three month period.

This service is very close to my heart and I am very passionate about what I do. I am committed to my job, as I can see how pleased and grateful people are and it makes my day better because I think that this service is giving people piece of mind and also contributing to their wellbeing”.

Self Directed Support – What's Happening?

We've included information about the new Self Directed Support scheme which is being introduced in Surrey but for those who might have missed this or not come across this term before;

What is self-directed support?

Self-directed support is a new method of providing social care. Following an assessment of your needs with social services, people will be given individual budgets which they will be able to use to organise, choose and pay for their own support, instead of social services arranging their care for them. The scheme is currently being piloted in parts of Surrey.

In February, we understand that 14 disabled people had gone through the application process for Self Directed Support and have services in place with another 110 people at some point in the application process. It sounds like it's going to be a long process before SCC rolls the scheme out across the whole county!

DLA Victory for People with Severe Visual Impairment



The Government have announce that from April 1st 2011 people with a severe visual impairment will be able to claim the higher rate of the mobility component of Disability Living Allowance. The exact details in terms of eligibility has not been announced yet but the RNIB think that it will include the following people;

- People with no light perception
- People with only light perception
- People who can only see hand movement in front of their face
- People who have 3/60 visual activity (Can only see the top line of an eye test chart from 3 metres away) and who also have a higher restricted field of vision

Congratulations to the RNIB and their supporters who fought a hard battle to get the change made.

Changes to Jobcentre Plus Benefit Payments

Jobcentre Plus have announced that at some point between April and October this year the way they pay benefits will change. The benefits that will be effected are;

- Income Support
- Jobseekers Allowance
- Incapacity Benefit
- Bereavement Benefit

If you are receiving any of these benefits, they will;

- Be paid a minimum of fortnightly and continue to be paid in arrears
- Be paid up to the same day for all of the above Jobcentre Plus benefits you may receive

As your benefit payment days will change, you should consider any regular payments you make such as direct debits or standing orders. Jobcentre Plus say they will contact anyone by letter, four weeks before they make the change.

Changes to Care Managers

Residents of Woking who have a Care Manager may or may not have received a letter to tell them of some changes in the structure of the care team in Woking.

It would appear that Woking Adult Service is being restructured into two sets of Care Managers. An 'Intake team' who will work with new referrals, carry out care assessments and help set up the care package before passing the person over to the 'long term' team. We understand from a spokesperson for Surrey County Council that "In this way we have managed to work within our target time of 28 days

which means that Service Users are being assessed and receiving their support, therefore enabling them to remain at home safely with the appropriate service in a timely manner”.

This change will mean that some Service Users will have a change in their existing Care Managers or Community Support Workers. According to Surrey County Council some letters did not get to the recipients to tell them of the change. We believe new letters have been sent. If you have a concern regarding this change, contact Surrey County Council Adult Social Care team in Woking and let them know. This new procedure has been in place in some other parts of Surrey for several years.

If you need advocacy support with this, we can help.
